Background

- **Guided by Climate Change Policy 2011.**
- The **objective** of the strategy is to identify the key approaches and interventions that will allow Nepal to maximise its resilience and low carbon growth potential *without compromising the overall growth potential* of all development sectors.
- Major sectors: 6 Technical (Energy, Industry, Transport, Forest, Agriculture, Building & Waste) and One Cross Cutting (GESI, Institution, Policy, Financing)
- Final draft is now in place as guiding document

Critical Challenges

- Integrated Landscape Planning considering poverty reduction (food security, deforestation and forest degradation, etc.)
- Reliable data and inadequate research
- Capacity Development and Awareness for policy makers and stakeholders
- Priority to link with adaptation/resilience rather than spell out the “Mitigation”
- Investments/financing

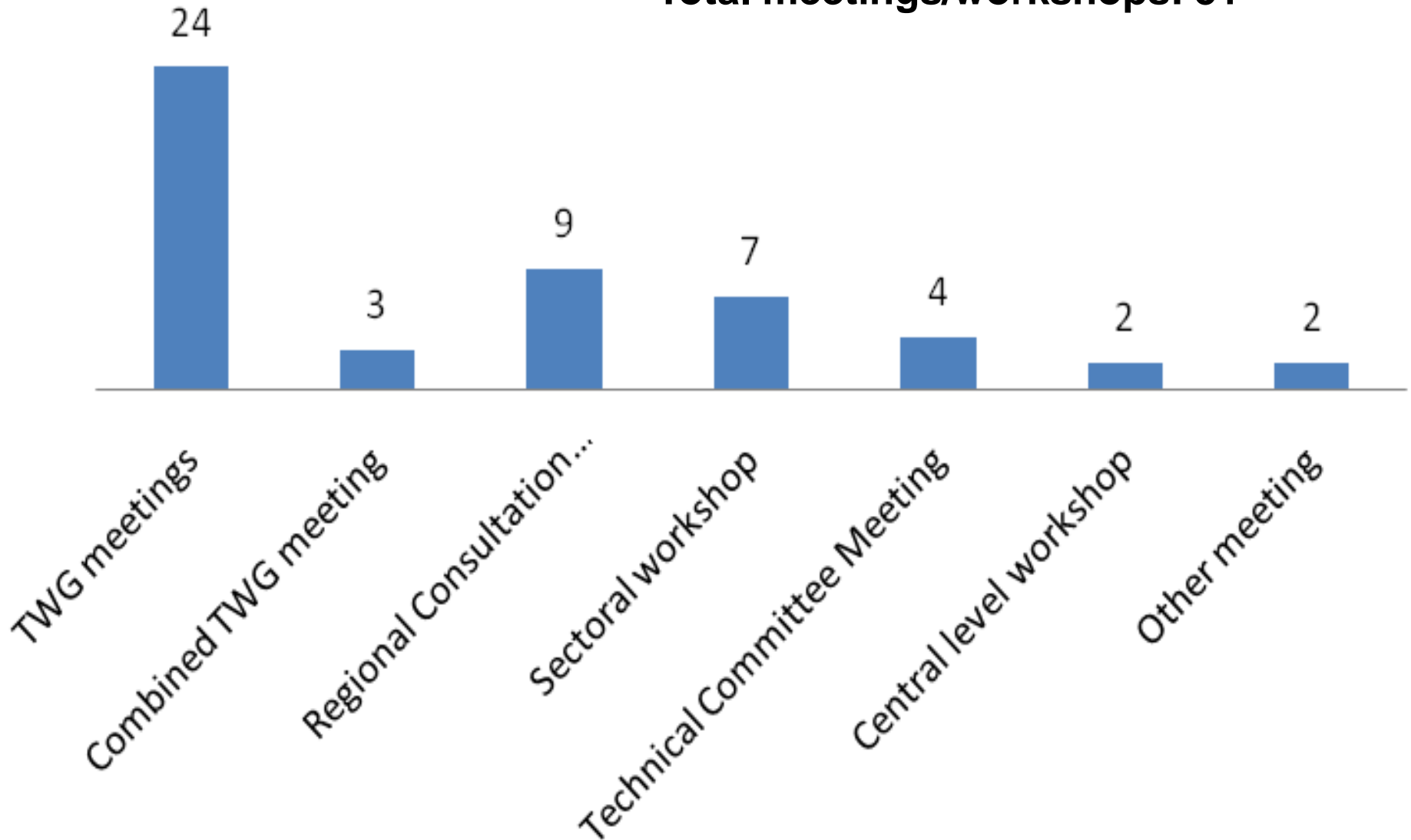
